

Resilience

We teach and build skills in resilience in a variety of ways at NPS. Resilience is the ability to cope with difficult times and 'bounce back' from adversity.

Here are some ways that students have tested their resilience at our site this fortnight:

- Zooper Doopers some children have been upset when they haven't been able to buy a Zooper Dooper.
- Some children are having difficulty playing tennis together.
- Losing in a game in PE is frustrating!
- Learning new skills in swimming can be scary.
- Not being able to sit where you want to in the classroom can be challenging.

Staff are currently working on surveying children about their perception of their resilience. This will help us build their capacity to cope with difficult situations. The SRC are also helping to promote strong resilience. One strategy suggested was 'you can feel sad inside but think maybe you could get a Zooper Dooper next week' (Lucy, Yr 4)

It is important to remember that positive stress, eg. learning a new skill is essential in the development of healthy minds. How do you support your child's resilience at home?


