Hi everyone,

Students in Year 3,5 and 7 have been working away on NAPLAN testing this week. Despite some technical issues, students demonstrated excellent resiliency and persistence in completing their tests. Testing for Napperby Primary School students is scheduled to finish on Monday.

Three weeks into our new class structures, routines and expectations have become well established. The general perception from all staff is that the class changes are definitely benefiting the students and their learning needs. Teachers and SSOs have been able to spend more time with each individual student and discover what it is that will help them to take the next steps in their learning.

Students have been setting goals that they have identified will help to progress their learning outcomes. I encourage all caregivers and parents to talk to your child about their goals. Find out what you can do to support them and be in contact with your child's teacher to see how their goals are progressing.

Reading

Reading remains the focus here at Napperby Primary School. Last week on the student free day, Staff spent the day with Miss Taran Harradine from the district office, developing and mapping out our approaches to teaching reading. The Staff have agreed on developing a consistent approach towards how reading is taught, using the most current and up to date methodologies and programs available. Staff will be taking part in further training over the course of the year to ensure the students at Napperby Primary School are receiving a world class education.

You can assist in developing your child's reading levels by listening to them read for 20 minutes every night. Every minute spent reading with or to your child helps them to reinforce the skills that they are learning and developing here at school.



The Leader's Loop




Hello everyone,
